By providing programs like:

- **Instruction** with a K-12 literacy focus and a specific K-3 reading initiative.
- **Technology** has a 1:1 ratio providing ChromeBooks to every middle and high school student (plans to expand to students in elementary schools) along with advanced courses in technology for students.
- **Support Services** increased to include: two school resource officers, an additional youth service director, district mental health counselor, social worker at Monticello Elementary, growing Migrant Education Program/English Language Learner program.
- **Extra-Curricular Teams** ranging from academics to athletics.
- **After School Programs and Summer Camps** stimulate learning in a wide variety of subjects.
- **Transportation** supports day to day travel, along with field trips and numerous extra-curricular trips while maintaining an excellent safety record.
- **Health and Wellness Programs** courtesy of the Health Kids Clinic, physical education classes and a district coordinated School Health Council.
- **Nutrition Services** provide a variety of serving options to meet students’ needs both during the school year and summer. The school garden provides fresh produce for the schools.
- **Transition Readiness** certifies students for college and career options.
- **Project Lead the Way** provides STEM curriculum to elementary, middle and high school students.
- **Gifted and Talented Services** are available to students featuring a very successful study abroad program.
- **The Learning Academy** offers students a non-traditional environment to complete their education.
- **WC Area Technology Center** offers programs with industry certifications benefiting students with workforce skills.
- **JROTC** has been recognized as a “Honor Unit with Distinction” for the past 25 years. Their mission is *to motivate young people to be better citizens.*
